

REIMAN GARDENS

IOWA STATE UNIVERSITY

- Created through a 1993 donation by ISU alumnus Roy Reiman and his wife, Bobbi
- Dedicated in 1995 and owned by Iowa State University
- Covers 14 acres just south of Jack Trice Stadium in Ames
- Comprised of:
 - Mahlstedt Horticulture Learning Center
 - Conservatory
 - Christina Reiman Butterfly Wing
 - Entryway, Bridge and Wetland Garden
 - Dunlap Entry Courtyard
 - Herb Garden
 - Helen Latch Jones Rose Garden
 - All-America Rose Selections (AARS) Trial and Display Garden
 - Margaret Penkhus Campanile Garden and Carillon
 - Town and Country Garden
 - Marge Hunziker House
 - Stafford Arboretum Garden
 - Patty Jischke Children's Garden
 - Lake Helen
 - Hillside Garden
- Attracts an estimated 200,000 visitors a year
- Winner of an All-America Rose Selections award for seven consecutive years
 - Received the AARS President's Award for outstanding rose care and maintenance in 2000
- Used for:
 - Classroom and laboratory for higher learning
 - Site for K-12 instruction
 - Inspiration for visitors, including hobby gardeners and professional horticulturists alike
 - Site for over 400 weddings, graduation and anniversary parties, meetings, lectures, concerts, and other special events
- Approximately 2,200 households are members of the CoHorts, Reiman Gardens' volunteer and membership organization
- The Gardens are open year-round, and hours are seasonal
